
Code of Conduct: Junior Members (under 18 years)

Therefore, members are encouraged to be open at all times to share any concerns or complaints that they may have about any aspect of the club with their coach, team manager, or another adult club member that they trust. NSVC has a Welfare Officer to deal with any concerns; this is Kate Lang Any breaches of the code of conduct may be subject to the clubs disciplinary process.

Junior Members (under 18 years) are expected to:

- Treat others with the respect and fairness that I would like them to show me, this includes
 the use of social media and networking sites;
- Compete within the rules and respect all officials and their decisions;
- Control tempers and avoid behaviour which may upset or inconvenience others;
- Keep to agreed timings for training & competitions or inform their coach or team manager if they are going to be late;
- Wear suitable kit for training & match sessions, as agreed with the coach and team manager: T-shirt (club t-shirts available), shorts, indoor suitable trainers & knee-pads (if desired).
- Support the wider club by participating in scoring and line judging for other teams when requested to;
- Not wear jewellery for any training sessions or matches;
